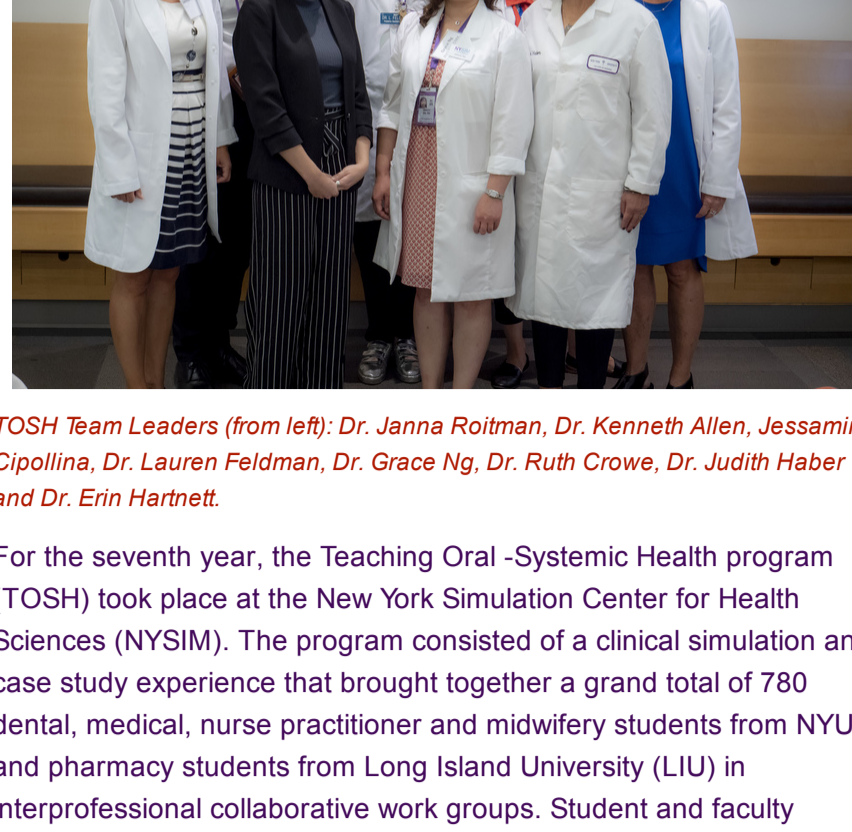


Spotlight on TOSH 7.0: An Interprofessional Success for Students



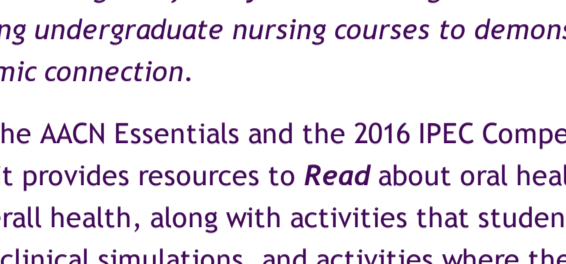

For the seventh year, the Teaching Oral -Systemic Health program (TOSH) took place at the New York Simulation Center for Health Sciences (NYSIM). The program consisted of a clinical simulation and case study experience that brought together a grand total of 780 dental, medical, nurse practitioner and midwifery students from NYU and pharmacy students from Long Island University (LIU) in interprofessional collaborative work groups. Student and faculty feedback shows a positive impact of the interprofessional TOSH simulation and case study experience where students collaborate to learn the HEENOT oral exam and develop an interprofessional management plan for a diabetic patient with oral health problems. We look forward to continuing this quality interprofessional programming in the years to come.

OHNEP is excited to announce **three** new publications co-authored by OHNEP's Dr. Erin Hartnett and Dr. Judith Haber and their interprofessional team.

The Interprofessional Role in Dental Caries Management: Impact of the Nursing Profession in Early Childhood Caries was recently published in the October issue of the journal of the Dental Clinics of North America.

This article addresses early childhood caries (ECC) as a population health issue that disproportionately affects children from diverse racial/ethnic and disadvantaged backgrounds. The OHNEP team and oral health champions in the NYU community had the opportunity to meet with Amy Villarosa, who is a Research Officer at the **Centre for Oral Health Outcomes & Research Translation (COHORT)** at the University of Western Sydney, Australia. COHORT is implementing interprofessional oral health programs in Maternity, Pediatrics, Aboriginal Health, Cardiovascular Health, Cancer, Diabetes, Palliative care and Disability. Dr. Hartnett has been appointed an Adjunct Associate Professor at the School of Nursing and Midwifery at Western Sydney University. Dr. Hartnett was invited to attend the launch of the National Network for Interdisciplinary Oral Health (NIOH) as part of the Asia Pacific Integrated Care Conference in Melbourne this November, and then on to Sydney to work with the COHORT team. NIOH Receives 2019 George E. Thibault Nexus Award

The National Interprofessional Initiative on Oral Health (NIOH) received the George E. Thibault Nexus Award at the National Center for Interprofessional Practice and Education Annual 2019-NEXUS conference. The NIOH was recognized as a visionary cross-organizational, systems-level partnership that is moving the needle in interprofessional oral health integration across practice and education. The award committee noted NIOH's strong leadership in transforming the way we work and think together about oral health education and practice.

Anita Glicken, MSW, NIOH Executive Director, accepted the award on behalf of the NIOH and its core partners, including *Smiles for Life*, a national oral health curriculum; OHNEP, the Oral Health Nursing Education and Practice Initiative, the PA Leadership Initiative in Oral Health and many other partner organizations who are working together to ensure that all persons have access to oral health education and care to improve overall health and wellbeing. She noted that "by putting the mouth back in the body and integrating oral health in to primary care, we are helping all providers, organizations and communities recognize that they are an important part of the oral health solution."

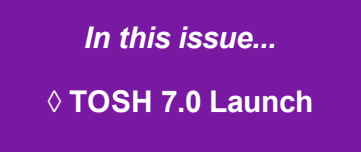
The Santa Fe Group, an action-oriented think tank with a passion to improve oral health for the public, hosted the 2019 Santa Fe Salon, **Comprehensive Health Without Oral Health: The Medicare Paradox**, May 8-10 in Arlington, Virginia. Santa Fe introduced more than 25 leading educators, researchers, policy makers, consumer advocates, and business leaders, our nations' leading health care change agents, who focused on the critical need for Medicare to include oral health benefits as a component of overall health care.

Congresswoman Donna Shalala, the longest serving Secretary of Health and Human Services who commissioned the first ever Surgeon General's Report on Oral Health in 2000, was the Day One Keynote Speaker. She presented her perspective on the progress she believes has been made as well as what further change needs to be made at either the administrative or legislative level.

AARP National Volunteer President and NYU Rory Meyers College of Nursing alumna, Dr. Catherine Alicia Georges, provided the Day Two Keynote addressing how inclusion of an oral health benefit in Medicare could help to stem the negative and financial impact on older adults; AARP's policy and advocacy recommendations and the actions AARP believes would meet seniors' oral health benefit needs.

Dr. Judith Haber, Professor at NYU Rory Meyers College of Nursing, Santa Fe Group Senior Scholar and Member of the Salon Planning Committee, moderated a panel, **Whole Person Care of Older Adults Through an Interprofessional Lens**. The session featured an interprofessional panel of non-dental oral health champions, including a physician, nurse practitioner, and physician assistant: Anita Glicken, MSW, Executive Director of the National Interprofessional Initiative on Oral Health (NIOH); Hugh Silk, MD, MPH, Co-PI for the HRSA funded Center for Integration of Primary Care and Oral Health (CIPCOH); Rita Jablonski, PH.D., CRNP, FAAN, FGSA, Associate Professor at the UAB School of Nursing; and Anthony Miller, MEd, PA-C, Professor, Shenandoah University. The panel focused on innovative national initiatives linking oral health with overall health that have a major impact on building interprofessional oral health workforce capacity that improve oral health and overall health care of older adults.

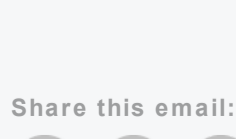

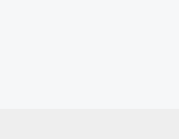
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
